AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution designating April 5, 1994, as John Dahl Day; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Legislature has had many illustrious members during its history and it is fitting that recognition be given to former members of the Legislature who provided leadership to said body; and

WHEREAS, John Dahl served with distinction in the State Senate from 1971 through 1990; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure, John Dahl served as Chairman of the Agriculture Committee from 1975 through 1980 and from 1985 through 1987, as Vice Chairman of the Policy Committee from 1981 through 1983, and as Chairman of the Wildlife Committee from 1988 through 1990; and

WHEREAS, John Dahl was responsible for the designation of the fiddle as the state instrument and "Faded Love" as the state country and western song; and

WHEREAS, John Dahl was inducted into the National Western Swing Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, for several years, John Dahl sponsored Bob Wills Day at the State Capitol; and

WHEREAS, John Dahl was a dynamic legislator who worked tirelessly for the betterment of the state; and

WHEREAS, John Dahl served this country for 26 years as a member of the United States Armed Forces, including service in the 45th Infantry Division, and duty during World War II and the Korean War; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Legislature to show respect for this outstanding former legislator.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 44TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT April 5, 1994, be designated as John Dahl Day.
