AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution designating May 4, 1994, as  
Kindness Day in Oklahoma.

WHEREAS, the citizens of Oklahoma live in a free country, based  
on the fundamental belief of tolerance and acceptance; and

WHEREAS, people have the responsibility to respect each other  
just as they would desire to be respected; and

WHEREAS, a basic element of respect is to show kindness to all  
people; and

WHEREAS, it would be most beneficial to the State of Oklahoma to  
emphasize the need of showing greater kindness to all people; and

WHEREAS, the residents of Yukon, Oklahoma, have completed their  
plans to have a Kindness Day on May 4, 1994; and

WHEREAS, it would benefit the entire state if there was a  
statewide Kindness Day in Oklahoma.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES  
OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 44TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE  
CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT May 4, 1994, is hereby designated as Kindness Day in Oklahoma, with special emphasis for everyone to be thoughtful, considerate and kind to everyone with whom they have dealings.
