AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution memorializing the service of Corporal Roy Linton; designating the bridge crossing Muddy Boggy Creek on U.S. Highway No. 75 as the "Roy Linton Bridge"; directing the Department of Transportation to place appropriate markers; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Roy Linton was raised in the Pine-Parker-Non area of northern Coal and southern Hughes County; and

WHEREAS, Corporal Roy Linton of the 755th Tank Battalion was killed while serving in Italy during World War II; and

WHEREAS, Corporal Roy Linton gave the ultimate sacrifice while proudly serving country, state and mankind during World War II.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 44TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the bridge over Muddy Boggy Creek on U.S. Highway No. 75 in Coal County be and is hereby designated the "Roy Linton Bridge" as a lasting testimonial to the courage and sacrifice of Corporal Roy Linton in the performance of his duties as a member of the 755th Tank Battalion during World War II.

THAT the Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers be placed upon said bridge bearing the name "Roy Linton Bridge" and an appropriate designation to memorialize the service of Corporal Roy Linton to his country.

THAT copies of this resolution be distributed to the Department of Transportation, Clarence Linton, Troy Linton, John Linton, Geneva Gayler, Delbert Inman, A.J. Hamersley, Billy McCarty, J.B. Blua and VFW Post 1198 Commander Arvard McLellan.
