HOUSE JOINT
RESOLUTION NO. 1076

AS INTRODUCED

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to the Oklahoma Constitution by amending Section 10 of Article XXIII; providing for public officials to receive changes in salary or emoluments during term of office; providing for changes in salary or emoluments at next general election; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE
2ND SESSION OF THE 44TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, the following proposed amendment to Section 10 of Article XXIII of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to read as follows:

Section 10. Except wherein otherwise provided in this Constitution, in no case shall the salary or emoluments of any public official be changed after his election or appointment, or during his term of office, unless by operation of law enacted prior to such election or appointment or until the next general election held in this state; nor shall the term of any public official be extended beyond the period for which he was elected or appointed: Provided, That all officers within this State shall continue to perform the duties of their offices until their successors shall be duly qualified.

SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in the following form:

THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:

This measure amends the Constitution. It amends Section 10 of Article 23. It provides that a public official may receive a change in salary. It provides that the salary change may occur during his term of office. The change in salary may occur only at the time of the next general election in the state.

SHALL THIS AMENDMENT BE APPROVED BY THE PEOPLE?

SECTION 3. The Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives, immediately after the passage of this resolution, shall prepare and file one copy thereof, including the Ballot Title set forth in SECTION 2 hereof, with the Secretary of State and one copy with the Attorney General.
