AS INTRODUCED

A Resolution memorializing Congress to oppose a national sales tax or value-added tax; stating that a national sales tax or value-added tax would hamper state and local government; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, President Clinton and his administration and other national leaders are currently proposing that Congress pass a national sales tax or a value-added tax; and

WHEREAS, a national sales tax or a value-added tax would affect every citizen in the United States; and

WHEREAS, a national sales tax or a value-added tax would have a direct adverse effect on state and local government; and

WHEREAS, a national sales tax or a value-added tax would significantly hamper the ability of state and local government in Oklahoma to increase the state or local sales tax if and when necessary.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 44TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives hereby memorializes the United States Congress to oppose any legislation proposing a national sales tax or a value-added tax in that such a tax would significantly hamper the ability of state and local government in Oklahoma to increase the state or local sales tax if and when necessary.

THAT copies of this resolution be distributed to the President Pro Tempore of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and the Oklahoma Congressional Delegation.
