AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to labor; authorizing counties to submit to a vote a question prohibiting certain requirements as a condition of employment or continued employment; requiring majority vote for approval; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 160 of Title 40, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A board of county commissioners may submit to the voters of a county for their approval at any regular or special election a question which affirms a person's right to work by prohibiting a person from being required, as a condition of employment or continuation of employment within the county, to be a member of or affiliated with a labor union or organization which exists for the purpose of dealing with employers concerning wages, rates of pay, hours of work, or other conditions of employment, or to financially support such a labor union or organization through any dues, fees, assessments or other charges of any kind. Approval of the question shall require a majority vote of the qualified voters voting in the election.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective September 1, 1993.
