

SHORT TITLE: Schools; placing requirements on private education support services providers; codification.

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to schools; requiring private education support services providers to provide evidence of felony record searches and drug testing of certain employees; prescribing certain terms of certain contracts; prohibiting changes in certain terms of certain contracts; and providing for codification.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-101.48 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Private support services providers that hire education support personnel and employ them in Oklahoma school districts shall provide the school district, regarding each such employee who works inside a school during school hours, with evidence that:

1. State and national felony record searches have been conducted, and the searches show the employee has not been convicted of a felony, criminal sexual activity, or sexual misconduct as defined in Section 6-101.41 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

2. The employee has been tested for the presence in his or her body of drugs, as defined in Section 552 of Title 40 of the Oklahoma Statutes, according to procedures prescribed in the Standards for Workplace Drug and Alcohol Testing Act, Section 551, et seq. of Title 40 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and the employee has tested negative for the presence of these drugs.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-101.49 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Contracts with a private provider for support services shall be for no longer than one (1) year and shall be subject to fiscal year limitations as set out in the laws of the State of Oklahoma.

SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-101.50 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Private support services providers may not increase charges or fees included in the contract during the term of the contract.
