AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to professions and occupations;
amending 59 O.S. 1991, Section 199.11, which
relates to causes for certain actions by the State
Board of Cosmetology; prohibiting board from
refusing to issue or renew or revoking or
suspending a license, certificate or registration
for conviction of a nonviolent felony; and
providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 1991, Section 199.11, is
amended to read as follows:

Section 199.11 The State Board of Cosmetology may either refuse
to issue a renewal license or may revoke or suspend any license,
certificate or registration in the manner set out in Section ~~3~~ 199.3
of this ~~act~~ title for any one or combination of the following
causes:

~~(a)~~ 1. Conviction of a felony as shown by a certified copy of
the record of the court~~;~~, except that the Board may not refuse to
issue or renew a license, certificate or registration, or may not
revoke or suspend a license, certificate or registration, if the
felony conviction is for a nonviolent offense, as such term is
defined in Section 571 of Title 57 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

~~(b)~~ 2. Gross malpractice or gross incompetence~~;~~;

~~(c)~~ 3. Fraud practiced in obtaining a license or registration~~;~~;

~~(d)~~ 4. When the licensee or certificate holder continues to practice after they become afflicted with an infectious, contagious, or communicable disease-i

~~(e)~~ 5. Habitual drunkenness or addiction to use of habit forming drugs-i

~~(f)~~ 6. Advertising by means of knowingly false or deceptive statements-i

~~(g)~~ 7. Continued or flagrant violation of any rules or regulations of the Board, or continued practice by an operator in a beauty shop wherein violations of the rules and regulations of the Board are being committed within the knowledge of the operator-i

~~(h)~~ 8. Failure to display license or certificate as provided in ~~this act.~~ Section 199.1 et seq. of this title;

~~(i)~~ 9. Continued practice of cosmetology after expiration of a license ~~therefor.~~; or

~~(j)~~ 10. Employment by a shop owner or manager of any person to perform any of the practices of cosmetology who is not duly licensed to perform said services.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective September 1, 1994.
