ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 233

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Strike the stricken title, enacting clause and
entire bill and insert

"(Corporation Commission - amending 74 O.S., Section 250.7
- compensation - noncodification -
emergency)

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 1991, Section 250.7, is
amended to read as follows:

Section 250.7 A. Each Corporation Commissioner holding office
after the effective date of this act shall receive as compensation
the salary established by the Legislature for Corporation
Commissioners. The person elected Corporation Commission Chairman by
those members constituting the Corporation Commission shall:

1. Set the Oklahoma Corporation Commission schedule for regular
meetings;

2. Serve or designate a representative to sit on certain boards
or committees;

3. Serve on the Oklahoma Public Employees Retirement System
Board of Trustees;

4. Preside in hearings conducted by the Corporation Commission;

5. Assure that the Commission secretary keeps and maintains appropriate records of all meetings held;

6. Respond as appropriate to matters pending before the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission and the Federal Communications Commission;

7. Ensure appropriate participation with the Interstate Oil and Gas Compact Commission and the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners; and

8. Have such other additional duties designated or specified by the Corporation Commission.

B. The Chairman of the Corporation Commission shall receive additional annual compensation in the amount of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) payable monthly, while serving in the capacity of Chairman.

SECTION 2. It is the intent of the Legislature that Section 1 of this act be an amendment to, and alteration of, Section 18a of Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma, as authorized by Section 35 of Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma.

SECTION 3. Section 2 of this act shall not be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval."
