AMENDMENT NO. 1. Strike the title, enacting clause and entire bill  
and insert

"( schools - State Board of Education - pilot projects -  
codification - effective date - emergency )

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.751 of Title 70, unless  
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The State Board of Education shall solicit proposals and, if  
funds are available, make grants for pilot projects that integrate  
health, social and other support services within a particular school  
site. The proposals shall be prepared in cooperation with personnel  
from the Department of Human Services, State Department of Health  
and the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services.

The proposals shall address the needs of children and their families who are in need of or who are currently receiving services from the state agencies specified herein.

B. The State Board of Education shall determine pilot project criteria and establish a process for the consideration of proposals. The criteria shall include, but not be limited to, local support for the pilot project from the community, district board of education and district superintendent. Proposals for pilot projects shall be considered on a statewide competitive basis.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.752 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

School-based health or screening services as authorized in Section 1 of this act shall not include family planning, abortion, abortion referral, abortion counseling or distribution of any contraceptive products or devices.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1995.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval."
