procedures to farm animals or livestock used for  
exhibition; \* \* \* providing for codification; and  
declaring an emergency.

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Page 1, lines 14 through 34, and page 2, lines 1  
through 7, delete all of Section 1 and insert a  
new Section 1 to read

"SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1229 of Title 21, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

For livestock utilized for exhibition purposes, it shall be  
unlawful for any person to inject into livestock or cause the  
livestock to ingest any drug, chemical or substance that is not  
labeled for use on animals, or to administer any chemical, device or  
substance routinely used on livestock to alter the appearance of  
livestock or to alter the muscle or fat content of the animal's  
carcass or to perform any surgical procedure to alter the appearance  
of the livestock. Ordinary and customary veterinarian procedures,  
including but not limited to dehorning, branding, tagging or

notching ears, castrating, deworming, vaccinating or docking the tail of farm animals, and any surgery of any kind not performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body or hide, shall not be prohibited by this section. Any violation of the provisions of this section shall be a misdemeanor, upon conviction, punishable by a fine of not less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), nor more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), or imprisonment in the county jail for not less than thirty (30) days nor more than one (1) year, or by both such fine and imprisonment. A second or subsequent violation of the provisions of this section shall be a felony, upon conviction, punishable by a fine of not less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), nor more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), or by imprisonment in the State Penitentiary for a term not less than one (1) year nor more than five (5) years, or by both such fine and imprisonment."

and in the title, page 1, line 8 1/2, after the word "to" and before the word "livestock" delete the words "farm animals or"
