AMENDMENT NO. 1. Strike the stricken title, enacting clause and
entire bill and insert

"(state government - terms - state agencies to coordinate
certain purchases - contracts - codification -
emergency)

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 85.9D of Title 74, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in this section:

1. "Consolidation contracts" shall mean contracts for several
state entities, entered into for the purposes of purchasing computer
software maintenance and hardware maintenance contracts in quantity;
and

2. "Enterprise contracts" shall mean agreements which would include all products used by this state that are manufactured, developed and designed by an individual vendor.

All agencies within the executive branch shall coordinate any purchases of computer software maintenance and hardware maintenance contracts through the Department of Central Services. The Department of Central Services is authorized to establish consolidated contracts and enterprise agreements for the purpose of purchasing computer software maintenance and hardware maintenance contracts.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 85.9E of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Contracts covered in this act shall be subject to the provisions of the Competitive Bidding Act as set forth in Section 101 et seq. of Title 61 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval."
