

ENGROSSED HOUSE  
BILL NO. 1062

An Act relating to crimes and punishments;  
prohibiting trespass on college or university  
property; providing exception; providing a penalty;  
providing additional penalty for trespass with  
damage or attempted damage to property; providing  
for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1835.2 of Title 21, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any person who willfully or maliciously enters or remains upon  
any public or private property, owned or leased by any college or  
university, or in any area or structure of the property when the  
entrance or remaining is plainly forbidden by signs, markings or  
otherwise, whether or not the property is enclosed, or by verbal  
command of an authorized officer or representative of the college or  
university, shall be deemed guilty of trespass and, upon conviction,  
shall be punished by a fine of not more than Two Hundred Fifty  
Dollars (\$250.00). However, this provision shall not apply to  
persons entering by authority of federal or state law or local

ordinance, or with the consent of the college or university administration. Any person who willfully or maliciously enters or remains upon any such property and therein commits or attempts to commit waste, theft or damage to the property shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than thirty (30) days nor more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 1995.
