BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 1991, Section 3218.8, as  
amended by Section 1, Chapter 348, O.S.L. 1993 (70 O.S. Supp. 1994,  
Section 3218.8), is amended to read as follows:

Section 3218.8 A. Except as otherwise provided by law, the  
Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education ~~are authorized to~~ may  
establish general enrollment fees per semester credit hour which  
shall not exceed:

Lower Division

Comprehensive Universities	\$48.60
Regional Universities	\$40.39
Two-year Colleges	\$25.97

Upper Division

Comprehensive Universities	\$51.84
Regional Universities	\$41.20

Graduate Division

Comprehensive Universities	\$68.85
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Regional Universities \$54.04

B. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education ~~are~~ authorized to shall require that nonresidents pay nonresident tuition in addition to general enrollment fees. Except as otherwise provided by law, said nonresident tuition per semester credit hour shall not exceed:

Lower Division

Comprehensive Universities	\$108.00
Regional Universities	\$ 68.75
Two-year Colleges	\$ 56.18

Upper Division

Comprehensive Universities	\$121.77
Regional Universities	\$ 75.97

Graduate Division

Comprehensive Universities	\$149.31
Regional Universities	\$ 88.54

C. Students permitted to audit courses shall pay the same general enrollment fees and nonresident tuition as required of students who enroll for course credit.

D. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall consider, upon request of an institutional governing board, the approval of differentiated general enrollment fees and nonresident tuition rates which may exceed the limits as established in this section by no more than two percent (2%); provided, no fee or tuition rate in effect for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1993, may exceed that of the previous year by more than eight percent (8%). Such differential as provided for in this subsection shall be authorized only at institutions with a full-time student enrollment, as defined by the State Regents, of nine thousand (9,000) or greater.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 626.11 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Persons incarcerated in state correctional facilities and persons who have been convicted of a felony offense are ineligible to receive Oklahoma tuition aid grants.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1995.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
