BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5009.1 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority in developing and converting the Oklahoma Medicaid program to a managed care system shall allow school districts to deliver screening services to Title XIX eligible children through school-based services. Schools shall be reimbursed for conducting screenings on children enrolled in the state Medicaid program.

B. School districts which provide therapeutic services to Medicaid-eligible children with physical or developmental disabilities pursuant to the Oklahoma Early Intervention Act or through the Act for Coordination of Special Services to Children and Youth shall receive Medicaid reimbursement for the Medicaid compensable services provided by the state program.

C. School districts having school-based health or screening services and health plans contracting with the Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall coordinate service for children enrolled in the state Medicaid program.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5009.2 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

School-based health or screening services as described in this act shall not include family planning, abortion counseling or distribution of any contraceptive products or devices.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1995.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
