An Act relating to the Courts; amending Section 21,
Chapter 264, O.S.L. 1994, which relates to duties
and compensation; establishing salaries of Chief
Judge of the Court of Appeals and the Court of
Appeals Judges; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 21, Chapter 264, O.S.L.
1994, is amended to read as follows:

Section 21. The duties and compensation of employees, not
otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed
upon the Court of Appeals by law shall be set by the Court of
Appeals, subject to the approval of the Supreme Court. ~~The~~ Until
the effective date of this act, the salary of each of the twelve
Court of Appeals Judges shall not exceed Seventy-eight Thousand Six
Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$78,660.00) each per annum, payable monthly.
Beginning on the effective date of this act, the salary of the Chief
Judge of the Court of Appeals shall be Eighty-two Thousand Five
Hundred Dollars (\$82,500.00) and the salary of each of the eleven
Court of Appeals Judges shall be Eighty-one Thousand Five Hundred
Dollars (\$81,500.00) per annum, payable monthly. Within forty-five

(45) days of the effective date of this act, the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals and each Court of Appeals Judge shall receive a one-time payment, in an amount equal to the difference of the amount of their base pay on January 1, 1995, and the amount their base pay would have been if the salary of the Chief Judge had been Eighty-two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$82,500.00) on January 1, 1995, and the salary of each of the Court of Appeals Judges had been Eighty-one Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$81,500.00) on January 1, 1995.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
