An Act relating to motor vehicles; making certain
conduct while operating a motor vehicle a felony;
establishing penalty; providing for codification;
and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-905 of Title 47, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any person who causes the death of another person while driving
or operating a motor vehicle within this state, in violation of the
provisions of subsection A of Section 11-902 of Title 47 of the
Oklahoma Statutes, shall be charged with a felony and, upon
conviction, shall be punished by imprisonment in a state
correctional facility for not less than one (1) year and not more
than ten (10) years and a fine of not more than Five Thousand
Dollars (\$5,000.00).

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 1996.
