

ENGROSSED HOUSE

An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S. 1991, Section 150.23, which relates to certain sidearms and badges; authorizing retired officers and agents and spouses of officers and agents of the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department and the Oklahoma Corporation Commission killed in the line of duty to have possession of certain firearms and badges; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 1991, Section 150.23, is amended to read as follows:

Section 150.23 A. An officer or agent of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation ~~or~~, the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control, the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department or the Oklahoma Corporation Commission shall be entitled to receive, upon retirement by reason of length of service, the continued custody and possession of the sidearm and badge carried by such officer or agent immediately prior to retirement.

B. An officer or agent of either Bureau or of the Department or of the Commission may be entitled to receive, upon retirement by reason of disability, the continued custody and possession of the

sidearm and badge carried by such officer or agent immediately prior to retirement upon written approval of the applicable Director of the appropriate Bureau or Department or upon written approval of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission in the case of an officer or agent of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission.

C. Custody and possession of the sidearm and badge of an officer or agent killed in the line of duty may be awarded by the applicable Director of the appropriate Bureau or the Department or by the Corporation in the case of an officer or agent of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission to the spouse or next-of-kin of the deceased officer or agent.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 1996.
