political commentators and conservative activists in recent times,
went to be with his Lord on May 14, 1996; and

WHEREAS, Jack was born in Tulsa, Oklahoma, on January 23, 1947, to Joe and Norene Edens and attended Edison High School in Tulsa and later the University of Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, even as a student Jack was involved in politics, being elected as student body president and being a member of the President's Leadership Class; and

WHEREAS, his love for the political arena and his concern about the welfare of his state and country led Jack to become involved in various state and national campaign efforts including the passage of State Question 640; and

WHEREAS, Jack Roth Edens was known as a conservative intellectual, a skillful debater, a political commentator and talk show host and columnist as well as a great friend of the taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, he did his best to air his conservative political and social values in order to help shape in a positive and Christian way our views on how our state, country and world should exist; and

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Legislature, realizing the love and respect Jack had for his family and friends, wish to give their condolences to those who were so special in Jack's heart.
