BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

COURT OF CRIMINAL APPEALS

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, the Court of Criminal Appeals shall budget all funds in the following categories:

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Court of Criminal Appeals by law shall be set by the Judges of the Court of Criminal Appeals. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, the salary of the Presiding Judge shall not exceed Ninety Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$90,500.00) per annum, payable monthly, and the salary of each of the four other Judges shall not exceed Eighty-seven Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$87,700.00) each per annum, payable monthly. The Court of Criminal Appeals, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees, except as

may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 5. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, the State Supreme Court shall budget all funds in the following categories:

SECTION 6. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the State Supreme Court by law shall be set by the Supreme Court Justices by majority vote. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, the salary of the Chief Justice shall be Ninety Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$90,500.00) and the salary of each of the eight (8) Associate Justices shall be Eighty-seven Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$87,700.00) each per annum, payable monthly.

SECTION 7. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Court of Appeals by law shall be set by the Court of Appeals, subject to the approval of the Supreme Court. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, the salary of the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals shall be Eighty-two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$82,500.00) and the salary of each of the eleven (11) Court

of Appeals Judges shall be Eighty-one Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$81,500.00) per annum, payable monthly.

SECTION 8. The State Supreme Court and the Court of Appeals for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations, on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures, excluding expenditures for capital and special projects and excluding lawful expenditures from the State Judicial Fund, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

The Workers' Compensation Court for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations, on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures, excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 11. This act shall become effective July 1, 1996.
