An Act relating to public health and safety;
creating the Oklahoma Health Care Authority Federal
Disallowance Fund; providing for purpose; providing
for deposits and expenditures; authorizing
transfers; providing for codification; providing an
effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5017 of Title 63, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a fund for the
Oklahoma Health Care Authority to be designated the "Oklahoma Health
Care Authority Federal Disallowance Fund". The fund shall be a
continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations. It shall
consist of monies received by the Oklahoma Health Care Authority
which, in the opinion of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority Board,
may be subject to federal disallowances and interest which may
accrue on said receipts. All monies accruing to the credit of said
fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the
Oklahoma Health Care Authority at the discretion of the Oklahoma
Health Care Authority Board for eventual settlement of the
appropriate pending disallowances. Expenditures from said fund
shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against
claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of State Finance
for approval and payment.

The Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority may
request the Director of State Finance to transfer monies between the
Oklahoma Health Care Authority Federal Disallowance Fund and any
other fund of the authority, as needed for the expenditure of funds.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1995.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
