BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 38 of Enrolled House Bill No. 1764 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 38. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the State Department of Education by law shall be set by the State ~~Department~~ Board of Education. The State Department of Education for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 47 of Enrolled House Bill No. 1764 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 47. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma School of Science and Mathematics by law shall be set by the Director. The salary of the Director shall not exceed ~~Fifty-nine Thousand Six Hundred Sixty-two Dollars (\$59,662.00)~~ Sixty Thousand Four Hundred Sixty-two Dollars (\$60,462.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996. The Oklahoma School of Science and Mathematics for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996 shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 3. AMENDATORY Section 48 of Enrolled House Bill No. 1764 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma Commission for Teacher Preparation by law shall be set by the Oklahoma Commission for Teacher Preparation. The salary of the Executive Director shall not exceed ~~Fifty-five Thousand~~

~~Dollars (\$55,000.00)~~ Fifty-five Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$55,800.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996. The Oklahoma Commission for Teacher Preparation for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 7. AMENDATORY Section 74 of Enrolled House Bill No. 1716 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, as amended by Section 6 of Enrolled House Bill No. 1717 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 6. There is hereby appropriated to the State Supreme Court from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the State Judicial Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, the sum of ~~Seventeen Million Twenty Thousand Six Hundred Eleven Dollars (\$17,020,611.00)~~ Seventeen Million One Hundred Fifty Thousand Two Hundred Eighty-four Dollars (\$17,150,284.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the District Courts by law.

SECTION 8. AMENDATORY Section 7 of Enrolled House Bill No. 1717 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 7. There is hereby appropriated to the State Supreme Court from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the State Judicial Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995, the sum of ~~One Million Six Hundred Eighty-four Thousand One Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$1,684,190.00)~~ Three Million Four Hundred Thirty-eight Thousand Six Hundred Sixty-two Dollars (\$3,438,662.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the District Courts by law.

SECTION 9. There is hereby appropriated to the State Supreme Court from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1994, the sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the District Courts by law.

SECTION 10. AMENDATORY Section 11 of Enrolled House Bill No. 1717 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 11. There is hereby appropriated to the State Supreme Court from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the Workers' Compensation Administration Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, ~~1996~~ 1994, the sum of One Hundred Five Thousand Seven Hundred Seventy-one Dollars (\$105,771.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the State Supreme Court or Court of Appeals by law.

SECTION 11. AMENDATORY Section 3 of Enrolled House Bill No. 1761 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 3. Of the full-time-equivalent employees authorized to the Department of Corrections, the Director may appoint a maximum of ~~eleven (11.0)~~ twelve (12.0) employees to the Oklahoma State Industries unclassified positions authorized in paragraph 30 of Section ~~840.8~~ 840-5.5 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 12. AMENDATORY Section 5 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 208 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 5. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Department of Rehabilitation Services by law shall be set by the Commission for Rehabilitation Services. The salary of the Director shall not exceed ~~Sixty-two Thousand Four Hundred Twenty-nine Dollars (\$62,429.00)~~ Sixty-two Thousand Sixty-nine Dollars (\$62,069.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996. The Department of Rehabilitation Services for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 13. AMENDATORY Section 9 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 208 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 9. There is hereby appropriated to the Office of Juvenile Affairs from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, the sum of One Million Eight Hundred Twenty-four Thousand Eight Hundred Forty Dollars (\$1,824,840.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the ~~Department of Human Services~~ Office of Juvenile Affairs by law.

SECTION 14. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, the Commission for Rehabilitation Services is authorized to employ licensed interpreters for the deaf and hearing impaired, including

but not limited to state employees, to provide interpreter licensing and evaluation services required by the Department of Rehabilitation Services. Persons employed by this section shall be subject to paragraph 8 of subsection A of Section 840-5.5 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes and shall not be subject to any limitations on full-time-equivalent employees for the Department of Rehabilitation Services imposed by law.

SECTION 15. The Office of State Finance is hereby directed to establish an agency number for the Employee Benefits Council.

SECTION 16. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall employ no more than three (3.0) attorneys.

SECTION 17. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority is authorized to pay professional expenses of the Medical Director, including dues, licenses, professional memberships, continuing medical education classes conducted in the State of Oklahoma, and medical malpractice insurance, provided that the Medical Director is a full-time employee of the Authority. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority is further authorized to pay medical malpractice insurance for any physician employed on a full-time basis.

SECTION 18. The University Hospitals Authority is hereby authorized to enter into lease-purchase financing agreements to develop off-campus community-based ambulatory care sites in geographically dispersed areas and to develop a Women's Health Center in the modernization of its obstetrics and gynecology service. The financing of said lease-purchase shall be competitively bid in accordance with the provisions of The Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act, Section 85.1 et seq. of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 19. AMENDATORY Section 11 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 196 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 11. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Military Department of the State of Oklahoma by law shall be set by the Adjutant General. The Military Department of the State of Oklahoma for the fiscal year ending June 30, ~~1995~~ 1996, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Office of Personnel Management by law shall be set by the Director of the Office of Personnel Management. The salary of the Director of the Office of Personnel Management shall not exceed ~~Fifty-nine Thousand Six Hundred Sixty-one Dollars (\$59,661.00)~~ Sixty Thousand Four Hundred Sixty-one Dollars (\$60,461.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996. The Office of Personnel Management for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of Oklahoma Statutes:

Expenditures from the Benefits Council Administration Revolving Fund shall not be subject to the budgetary limitations established for the Office of Personnel Management in this act.

SECTION 21. AMENDATORY Section 8 of Enrolled House Bill No. 1729 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 8. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation by law shall be set by the Director. The salary of the Director shall not exceed Sixty-one Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-four Dollars (\$61,474.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996. One (1.0) Information Representative, one (1.0) Legal Officer and two (2.0) Special Investigators shall be unclassified positions. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 22. AMENDATORY Section 10 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 211 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 10. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Physician Manpower Training Commission by law shall be set by the Physician Manpower Training Commission. The salary of the Executive Director shall not exceed ~~Forty-three Thousand Nine Hundred Ten Dollars (\$43,910.00)~~ Forty-four Thousand Seven Hundred Ten Dollars (\$44,710.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996. The Physician Manpower Training Commission for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 23. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, the Oklahoma Historical Society is authorized to maintain an amount not to exceed Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) in the petty cash fund for the Oklahoma Historical Society. This fund may be allocated to museums and sites owned and operated by the Oklahoma Historical Society in amounts not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) per museum or site for the purpose of establishing separate petty cash fund accounts. Said fund may be established from any state funds available to the Oklahoma Historical Society for general operating expenses and shall be administered under such rules and regulations as prescribed by the Director of State Finance.

SECTION 24. AMENDATORY Section 1 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 188 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated to the LP Gas Research, Marketing and Safety Revolving Fund of the Oklahoma Liquefied Petroleum Gas Research Marketing and Safety Commission from any

monies not otherwise appropriated from the ~~Cash Flow Reserve Fund designated by the Office of State Finance as the "094" Fund~~ Special Cash Fund of the State Treasury, the sum of Fifty-four Thousand Dollars (\$54,000.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to support the operations of the Oklahoma Liquefied Petroleum Gas Research, Marketing and Safety Commission.

SECTION 25. On July 1, 1995, or as soon thereafter as possible, the Director of State Finance is hereby authorized to transfer from the disbursing funds designated by the Office of State Finance as 325, 340 and 365 of the Department of Human Services, (a) any amount identified by the Department of Human Services as FY-95 carryover funding associated with the Office of Juvenile Justice which shall be transferred to a disbursing fund which shall be established by the Office of State Finance for the Office of Juvenile Affairs, and (b) any amount identified by the Department of Human Services in conjunction with the Oklahoma Health Care Authority as FY-95 carryover funding associated with the state Medicaid program, excluding Medicaid programs retained by the Department of Human Services and the Medical Services Division of the Department of Human Services which shall be transferred to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority Revolving Fund established by law. Once the Department of Human Services has determined that all outstanding obligations associated with the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995, for programs of the Office of Juvenile Justice and the state Medicaid program, excluding Medicaid programs retained by the Department of Human Services and the Medical Services Division of the Department of Human Services, the Director of State Finance shall transfer any remaining funds associated with these programs to either the disbursing fund of the Office of Juvenile Affairs or to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority Revolving Fund, whichever is appropriate.

SECTION 26. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, the Department of Corrections shall develop and implement a special treatment program for inmates with severe psychiatric problems, including inmates convicted of sex-related offenses and inmates that have prior convictions for sex-related offenses.

SECTION 27. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth by law shall be set by the Director. The salary of the Director shall not exceed Forty-six Thousand Two Hundred Twenty-eight Dollars (\$46,228.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996. The Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 28. Funds appropriated to the Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth in Section 66, Chapter 187, O.S.L. 1994, and Section 1, Chapter 252, O.S.L. 1994, may be budgeted and expended for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, and may be budgeted and expended for the general operating expenses of the Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth regardless of the purpose for which the funds were budgeted by the agency for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995.

SECTION 29. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Office of Handicapped Concerns by law shall be set by the

Director. The salary of the Director shall not exceed Thirty-seven Thousand Nine Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$37,925.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996. The Office of Handicapped Concerns for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 30. Funds appropriated to the Office of Handicapped Concerns in Section 67, Chapter 187, O.S.L. 1994, and Section 5, Chapter 252, O.S.L. 1994, may be budgeted and expended for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, and may be budgeted and expended for the general operating expenses of the Office of Handicapped Concerns regardless of the purpose for which the funds were budgeted by the agency for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996.

SECTION 31. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma Human Rights Commission by law shall be set by the Director. The salary of the Director shall not exceed Forty-nine Thousand Dollars (\$49,000.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996. The Oklahoma Human Rights Commission, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 32. Funds appropriated to the Human Rights Commission in Section 69, Chapter 187, O.S.L. 1994, as amended by Section 8, Chapter 252, O.S.L. 1994, may be budgeted and expended for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, and may be budgeted and expended for the general operating expenses of the Human Rights Commission regardless of the purpose for which the funds were budgeted by the agency for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995.

SECTION 33. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma Indian Affairs Commission by law shall be set by the Director of the Oklahoma Indian Affairs Commission. The salary of the Director shall not exceed Thirty-seven Thousand Five Hundred Thirty-six Dollars (\$37,536.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996. The Oklahoma Indian Affairs Commission for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 34. Funds appropriated to the Indian Affairs Commission in Section 77, Chapter 187, O.S.L. 1994, as amended by Section 10, Chapter 252, O.S.L. 1994, may be budgeted and expended for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, and may be budgeted and expended for the general operating expenses of the Indian Affairs Commission

regardless of the purpose for which the funds were budgeted by the agency for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995.

SECTION 35. Municipalities and counties assisted by the Department of Commerce with federal pass through funds may elect to utilize the services of their substate planning district, private contractors or their own staff in implementing the projects. In selecting private professional contractors, including engineers, architects, planners, administrators and accountants, the municipalities and counties may utilize their own procedures, if those procedures are consistent with state statutes, federal regulations and the requirements of particular federal funding sources, including requests for proposals or bids.

SECTION 36. TRANSFER The Director of State Finance, on the effective date of this act, shall transfer the sum of One Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$120,000.00) from the Oklahoma Certified Real Estate Appraisers Revolving Fund of the Insurance Department of the State of Oklahoma to the Special Cash Fund of the State Treasury.

SECTION 37. TRANSFER The Director of State Finance, on the effective date of this act, shall transfer the sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) from the Workers' Compensation Enforcement Revolving Fund of the Department of Labor to the Special Cash Fund of the State Treasury.

SECTION 38. TRANSFER The Director of State Finance, on the effective date of this act, shall transfer the sum of Three Hundred Forty-seven Thousand Dollars (\$347,000.00) from the Safety Consultation and Regulation Revolving Fund of the Department of Labor to the Special Cash Fund of the State Treasury.

SECTION 39. TRANSFER The Director of State Finance, on the effective date of this act, shall transfer the sum of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) from the Oklahoma Securities Commission Revolving Fund of the Oklahoma Securities Commission to the Special Cash Fund of the State Treasury.

SECTION 40. REPEALER Section 6 of Enrolled House Bill No. 1736 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 41. REPEALER Sections 11, 14 and 15 of Enrolled House Bill No. 1740 of the 1st Session of the 45th Oklahoma Legislature, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 42. Sections 1 through 35 of this act shall become effective July 1, 1995.
