An Act relating to law enforcement agencies; making appropriations to the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission; stating purpose; making an appropriation to the Department of Public Safety; stating purpose; providing lapse date; authorizing certain funds to be budgeted for certain purpose after certain date; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, the sum of Forty-six Thousand Seven Hundred Sixty-four Dollars (\$46,764.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to upgrade vehicles to ensure the safety of the agents of the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission, protect the general public and perform the duties imposed upon the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission by law.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated to the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, the sum of Fifty-four Thousand Four Hundred Twenty-three Dollars (\$54,423.00) or so much thereof as may be needed by the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission to perform its duties protecting the general public.

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of Public Safety from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, the sum of Three Hundred Six Thousand Five Hundred Thirty-eight Dollars (\$306,538.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to conduct a Highway Patrol Academy to maintain the manpower required to save lives, protect the public property and perform the duties imposed upon the Department of Public Safety by law.

SECTION 4. The appropriations made by this act, not including appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996 (hereafter FY-96) or may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997 (hereafter FY-97). Funds budgeted for FY-96 may be encumbered through June 30, 1996, and must be expended by November 15, 1996. Any funds remaining after November 15, 1996, and not budgeted for FY-97, shall lapse to

the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year. Funds budgeted for FY-97 may be encumbered only through June 30, 1997. Any funds remaining after November 15, 1997, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year. These appropriations may not be budgeted in both fiscal years simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-96, and not required to pay obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-97, after the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds from the FY-96 budget work program and after such revision has been approved by the Office of State Finance.

SECTION 5. This act shall become effective September 1, 1995.
