An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending 21 O.S. 1991, Section 1753.8, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 127, O.S.L. 1993 (21 O.S. Supp. 1995, Section 1753.8), which relates to defacing, stealing or possessing road signs or markers; modifying penalty; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 1991, Section 1753.8, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 127, O.S.L. 1993 (21 O.S. Supp. 1995, Section 1753.8), is amended to read as follows:

Section 1753.8 A. Any person who defaces, steals or possesses any road sign or marker posted by any city, state or county shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), or restitution which shall be paid to the city, state or county, or by not more than twenty (20) days of community service, or by imprisonment in the county jail for a term of not more than thirty (30) days, or by both such fine and , imprisonment, community service, or restitution, as the Court may order.

B. If a violation of subsection A of this section results in personal injury to or death of any person, the person committing the violation shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a felony, punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for not more than two (2) years, or by a fine of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or restitution which shall be paid to the city, state or county, or by not less than forty (40) days of community service, or by both such combination of fine and, imprisonment, community service, and/or restitution, as the Court may order.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 1996.
