An Act relating to the Red River Boundary Commission; amending Section 1 of Enrolled House Joint Resolution No. 1011, p. 2115, O.S.L. 1995; modifying description of geographic areas represented by Commission; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1 of Enrolled House Joint Resolution No. 1011, p. 2115, O.S.L. 1995, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1. A. A Red River Boundary Commission is hereby re-created. The Commission shall consist of the Attorney General of the State of Oklahoma, a designee of the Governor of the State of Oklahoma, a representative of the Kiowa, Comanche and Apache Land Use Committee to be appointed by the Oklahoma Indian Affairs Commission, those members of the Oklahoma State Senate who represent areas which border the Red River between the Arkansas border and the ~~mouth of the North Fork of the Red River~~ Texas border, and those members of the Oklahoma House of Representatives who represent areas which border the Red River between the Arkansas border and the ~~mouth of the North Fork of the Red River~~ Texas border.

B. Such members shall serve without additional compensation each of whom may from time to time serve by and through a person designated by the member in writing for that purpose. Legislative members shall receive reimbursement from the house in which they serve pursuant to the provisions of Section 456 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Other members of the Commission who are state employees shall receive reimbursement pursuant to the State Travel Reimbursement Act from the funds of their employing agency. The appointee of the Oklahoma Indian Affairs Commission shall receive reimbursement pursuant to the State Travel Reimbursement Act from the funds of the Department of Central Services.

C. Staffing for the Red River Boundary Commission shall be provided by the Legislative Service Bureau.

SECTION 2. CODIFICATION Section 1 of Enrolled House Joint Resolution No. 1011, p. 2115, O.S.L. 1995, as amended by Section 1 of this act, shall be codified as Section 6101 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, Section 2 of Enrolled House Joint Resolution No. 1011, p. 2115, O.S.L. 1995, shall be codified as Section 6102 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, Section 3 of Enrolled House Joint Resolution No. 1011, p. 2115, O.S.L. 1995, shall be codified as Section 6103 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes and Section 4 of Enrolled House Joint Resolution No. 1011, p. 2115, O.S.L. 1995, shall be codified as Section 6104 of Title 74

of the Oklahoma Statutes, unless there is created a duplication in numbering.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this resolution shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
