A Concurrent Resolution praising and commending the countless men, women, children, businesses and organizations who have participated in the search, rescue, recovery and relief efforts in the wake of the cowardly bomb attack on the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City; expressing admiration and gratitude; and expressing legislative intent.

WHEREAS, on Wednesday, April 19, 1995, at 9:02 a.m., the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, was the target of a cowardly terrorist bomb attack that virtually destroyed the building, damaged dozens of buildings in the downtown area, and killed or wounded hundreds of persons; and

WHEREAS, this attack on the very fabric of our national community is the worst bomb attack in the nation's history on American soil and has shocked, frightened, angered, bewildered and saddened the citizens of Oklahoma and the United States; and

WHEREAS, despite our fear and emotions, hundreds of individuals almost instantly descended on the Murrah Building to begin the urgent and arduous task of helping those who were injured and have continued their search efforts in the face of unspeakable horror and danger; and

WHEREAS, these heroes, which included law enforcement officers, state and federal military personnel, firefighters, search and rescue professionals, doctors, nurses, emergency medical technicians, medicolegal officials, office workers, and volunteers from throughout the country as diverse as our shared heritage; and

WHEREAS, the rescue effort continues as our entire nation continues its prayers that more of the victims of this blast will be found alive in the rubble and that the healing process for us all can begin; and

WHEREAS, as the magnitude of this attack has become clear, countless other everyday citizens continue to give of themselves, ensuring this cowardly, evil attack does not achieve its goal of planting dissention and fear in the United States; and

WHEREAS, people are donating their time, food, clothing and money to relief organizations, donating blood to ensure the injured have a chance to recover, donating vital equipment to the search and rescue teams still combing the remains of the building for survivors and victims; and

WHEREAS, the list of individuals, organizations, churches and businesses who have come together in one of the largest relief efforts in American history is virtually endless, encompassing the entire mosaic of people that is the United States; and

WHEREAS, the people of this state and nation have responded to unspeakable violence and cowardice with unsurpassed courage and compassion.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 45TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature hereby praises and commends the countless men, women, children, businesses and organizations who have participated in the search, rescue, recovery and relief efforts in the wake of the cowardly terrorist bomb attack on the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City.

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature expresses its boundless admiration and deep gratitude, on behalf of all Oklahomans, to the countless men, women, children, businesses and organizations who are coming together to provide comfort and compassion to the victims of this attack and their families.

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature hereby expresses its strong intent that this state will not be torn asunder by this cowardly, evil attack on the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building.

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature expresses its deep sorrow for all those who have been harmed by the unconscionable act of these terrorists.
