WHEREAS, Nathaniel Quinn passed away on Friday, February 23, 1996, while valiantly helping to fight a grass fire in Okfuskee County that threatened the lives and property of citizens of that county; and

WHEREAS, Nathaniel Quinn was born on April 19, 1929, in Lima, Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, Nathaniel Quinn was married to Ruth Quinn and together they raised three children, Valecia Annette, Karl James and Nathaniel Jr.; and

WHEREAS, Nathaniel Quinn was a retired educator who loved to teach and devoted his life to teaching others; and

WHEREAS, Nathaniel Quinn during his career was an educator and basketball coach at Wewoka Douglass, Ardmore Douglass and Boley High School, and later served as Superintendent of Schools for the Department of Corrections; and

WHEREAS, Nathaniel Quinn coached three state basketball championships and was inducted into the Oklahoma Coaches Hall of Fame in 1981; and

WHEREAS, Nathaniel Quinn served as a member and treasurer of the IXL Volunteer Fire Department, and was faithfully performing such service at the time of his death; and

WHEREAS, Nathaniel Quinn was a member of the Masonic Lodge and the Retired Teachers Association; and

WHEREAS, Nathaniel Quinn will be eulogized at Amos Temple C.M.E. Church in Boley, Oklahoma and laid to rest at Ebenezer Cemetery, Castle, on Friday, March 1, 1996; and
