A Concurrent Resolution praising the efforts of Henry Jo Von Tungeln to promote the wheat industry and agriculture in general; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, wheat is the number one food and feed grain in the United States and in the world; and

WHEREAS, Oklahoma is the second largest Hard Red Winter Wheat producer in the nation; and

WHEREAS, wheat is the number one grain crop in Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, wheat accounts for over one-half billion in gross ag receipts every year in Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, wheat is a grazing plus grain crop in Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, Henry Jo Von Tungeln of Calumet, Oklahoma, was appointed to serve on the Oklahoma Wheat Commission Board of Directors in 1988 representing the District III counties of Beckham, Blaine, Canadian, Custer, Dewey, Kingfisher, Roger Mills and Washita; and

WHEREAS, Henry Jo Von Tungeln currently serves as Secretary-Treasurer of the Oklahoma Wheat Commission and has previously served as Vice-Chairman and Chairman; and

WHEREAS, Henry Jo Von Tungeln serves on the U.S. Wheat Associates Board of Directors and Wheat Foods Council Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, Henry Jo Von Tungeln serves on the Farm Bureau Board of Directors representing District III; and

WHEREAS, Henry Jo Von Tungeln has farmed for forty-eight years and represents his family's sixth generation to farm in Canadian County; and

WHEREAS, Henry Jo Von Tungeln has humbly and generously contributed his time and talents to baking hundreds of loaves of bread throughout the night, and delivers, distributes and shares his bread personally; and

WHEREAS, while serving eight years on the Oklahoma Wheat Commission Board of Directors, Henry Jo Von Tungeln has baked and served over two hundred loaves of bread each year for Pre-Ag Day to members of the Oklahoma Legislature and others, thereby promoting participation in Ag Day which is a nationwide and statewide annual celebration of the many persons who provide Americans and others worldwide with food and fiber; and

WHEREAS, during his time with the Oklahoma Wheat Commission and again this year, Henry Jo Von Tungeln is serving his homebaked bread on Ag Day to promote unity in the food and agriculture community while providing an opportunity to educate the nonfarm public about agriculture.
