A Concurrent Resolution praising the life and achievements  
of the late Joseph Lewis "Jody" Latimer; honoring his  
memory; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Joseph Lewis "Jody" Latimer was born February 27, 1972, in Rockhill, South Carolina. Jody, the son of Joe and Brenda Latimer, lived in Oklahoma since his early childhood. He was married to the former Stacy Stewart and was the father of a daughter Jillian who is now 21 months old; and

WHEREAS, Jody graduated from Geronimo High School in 1991, where he lettered in basketball and baseball, playing in the state tournament for both sports during his senior year. Jody's basketball jersey was retired in January of this year. Jody was also a member of the L.A. Dragway Racing Team; and

WHEREAS, Jody Latimer served as a reserve officer for the city of Geronimo; was elected Chief of Police for Geronimo; served in the Geronimo Volunteer Fire Department, and was an emergency medical technician for the Geronimo Volunteer Ambulance Services. He had been a deputy sheriff of Cotton County since June 1, 1995; and

WHEREAS, on October 18, 1995, Jody Latimer lost his life in the line of duty. While responding to a request for assistance at the scene of a drive-by shooting, he was killed when his patrol car was involved in an accident en route; and

WHEREAS, the State of Oklahoma and Cotton County owe a great debt of gratitude to Deputy Jody Latimer and all other law enforcement officers who risk their lives daily to protect the lives and property of the citizens of this great state.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 45TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature praises the life and achievements of the late Joseph Lewis "Jody" Latimer.

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature honors the memory of Joseph Lewis "Jody" Latimer.
