HOUSE BILL NO. 1639

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to prisons and reformatories;
prohibiting incarcerated inmates from possessing or
using certain items; requiring institutions to
provide for physical exercise for inmates,
excluding certain equipment and training; limiting
items institution canteens are allowed to provide
to inmates; providing for codification; and
providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 510.11 of Title 57, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. No inmate incarcerated in an institution under the
jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections shall:

1. Possess or use tobacco products;
2. Possess any television set, cablevision or other video
equipment in the inmate's cell; or
3. Possess food items that are not provided by the facility to
all inmates, regardless of the source or funding for such items.

B. All correctional institutions shall provide inmates opportunity for physical exercise but shall not provide weight lifting equipment, martial arts training or specialized physical training.

C. Institution canteen services shall provide only reading material, writing material and personal hygiene products to inmates.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 1995.
