AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to torts; providing immunity to certain individuals for services rendered under certain circumstances; defining term; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 32 of Title 76, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Any person who is retired from the practice of any method of treatment of human ailment, disease, pain, injury, deformity, or mental or physical condition, and who, in good faith, voluntarily provides needed care or treatment without the expectation of payment, shall be immune from liability from any civil action arising out of the provision of that care and treatment.

B. For purposes of this section, "retired" means no longer providing care and treatment to patients in an active practice and no longer maintaining regular office hours.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 1996.
