SENATE BILL NO. 1027

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to Oklahoma Today Magazine employees; amending 74 O.S. 1991, Section 1825, which relates to positions in the Division of Lodges in the unclassified service; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 1991, Section 1825, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1825. A. Positions within the Division of Lodges of the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department shall be in the unclassified service and shall not be subject to any of the provisions of the Oklahoma Personnel Act, or to any rules and regulations promulgated by the Office of Personnel Management except leave regulations. No employee of the Division of Lodges shall be transferred to the unclassified service without ~~his~~ the employee's consent.

B. Except as otherwise provided by law, positions within Oklahoma Today Magazine Division of the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department shall be in the unclassified service and shall not be subject to any of the provisions of the Oklahoma Personnel Act, or to any rules and regulations promulgated by the Office of Personnel Management except leave regulations. Any classified employee of Oklahoma Today Magazine Division on the effective date

of this legislation shall have the option of retaining classified status. Any incumbent who chooses to change status from classified to unclassified shall so indicate in writing. All future appointments to such positions shall be in the unclassified service.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1996.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
