

SHORT TITLE: Exterminators; requiring certain public notice prior to chemical spraying; codification; effective date.

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to exterminators; requiring certain warning signs to be posted prior to applying certain pesticides for certain time periods; requiring State Board of Agriculture to develop rules regulating warning signs; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-62.1 of Title 2, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. It shall be unlawful for any person to apply any insecticide, fungicide, rodenticide, or other pesticides in the form of sprays, dusts, aerosols, or fogs in any building open to the public for business without first posting warning signs on the property involved at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the application. Warning signs shall be left in place for fourteen (14) days following the application. Warning signs shall include information advising as to the type of chemicals and the active ingredients being applied.

B. The State Board of Agriculture shall develop rules governing the size, posting requirements, and necessary information to be included in warning signs required by this section.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 1996.
