AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to public health and safety; creating the Oklahoma Health Care Delivery Advisory Commission; providing for powers and duties; providing for appointment, membership and terms and travel reimbursement; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5001.1 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. There is hereby created until June 30, 2000, an Oklahoma Health Care Delivery Advisory Commission to study any administrative directives or rules, promulgated by any state agency, authority, board or commission, which affect the delivery of health care in the State of Oklahoma. It shall be the power and duty of the Commission to receive for consideration and each state entity hereby affected shall forward, prior to implementation by such state entity, all proposed administrative directives or rules that affect the delivery of health care in this state.

B. The Commission shall be composed of twenty-four (24) members as follows:

1. Six legislators, three of whom shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and three of whom shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

2. Six physicians, licensed in this state, who shall be appointed by the Governor, one from each congressional district;

3. Six hospital administrators, who shall be appointed by the Governor, one from each congressional district; and

4. Six allied health care professionals, who shall be appointed by the Governor, one from each congressional district.

C. Members so appointed shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority and shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for necessary travel pursuant to the provisions of the State Travel Reimbursement Act, Section 500.1 et seq. of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1996.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
