

SHORT TITLE: Motor carriers; directing Oklahoma Department of Transportation to enter into multi-state oversize and overweight permitting agreements; specifying routes; emergency.

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to motor carriers; amending Section 1, Chapter 122, O.S.L. 1995 (47 O.S. Supp. 1995, Section 14-118.1), which relates to multi-state oversize and overweight permits; requiring Department of Transportation to issue such permits; requiring Commissioner of Public Safety to promulgate certain rules; designating certain routes for vehicles operating under such permits; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 122, O.S.L. 1995 (47 O.S. Supp. 1995, Section 14-118.1), is amended to read as follows:

Section 14-118.1 A. The Department of Transportation ~~Commission is authorized to~~ shall enter into agreements with governmental entities outside this state for the issuance of regional and national oversize and overweight permits for single-trip nondivisible loads and ~~shall adopt such rules as are necessary to implement the agreements.~~ The Commissioner of Public Safety shall adopt rules necessary to implement the agreements and shall issue multi-state permits for single-trip nondivisible loads in accordance with ~~rules adopted by the Transportation Commission~~ the terms of the agreements and shall receive and remit permit fees from

a Department of Public Safety special account in accordance with the agreements and state law.

B. The Department shall designate as routes for vehicles operating under regional and national permits the following routes and such other routes as the Department may determine appropriate:

1. I-35 from the Texas state line to the Kansas state line;

2. I-40 from the Texas state line to its junction with I-44;

3. I-44 south from I-40 to its junction with I-240, I-240 east to its junction with I-40, and I-40 to the Arkansas state line;

4. I-44 from the Texas state line to the Missouri state line;

5. US 69 from the Texas state line to its junction with I-44;

and

6. US 287 from the Texas state line to the Colorado state line.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
