AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution authorizing the Commission for Human Services to enter into an agreement for construction of a building for certain purpose in Rogers County, Oklahoma; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Section 189a of Title 56 of the Oklahoma Statutes provides that the board of county commissioners of each county shall furnish quarters for local units of the Department of Human Services unless it is determined that adequate or suitable quarters from the county are not available or obtainable; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that existing quarters for local units of the Department of Human Services in Rogers County, Oklahoma, are crowded and are thereby inadequate and unsuitable, and the county is unable to comply with its legal obligations pursuant to Section 189a of Title 56 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

WHEREAS, Rogers County, Oklahoma, is undertaking a project via the Rogers County Public Health Facilities Authority to provide office space to the Department of Human Services through the construction of a building which it will subsequently lease to the Department; and

WHEREAS, Section 189a of Title 56 of the Oklahoma Statutes provides that this type of transaction shall be authorized by the Legislature.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 45TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT in order to offer accessible and comprehensive services to clients of the Department of Human Services in Rogers County, Oklahoma, the Commission for Human Services is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the Rogers County Public Health Facilities Authority for the construction of a building to provide office space for the local unit of the Department in Rogers County, Oklahoma.

THAT copies of this resolution be distributed to the Commission for Human Services, the Board of County Commissioners of Rogers County, Oklahoma, and the Rogers County Public Health Facilities Authority.
