CONFERENCE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to education; providing procedure for reemployment of public school administrators; requiring school districts to notify administrators of recommendation not to reemploy by certain date; requiring administrators to notify school district of desire not to be reemployed by certain date; providing for continued employment upon certain conditions; providing for computation of salary according to certain schedule; exempting superintendents from provisions of act; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-101a of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

If, prior to April 10, a board of education has not entered into a written contract with an administrator or notified the administrator in writing by registered or certified mail that a recommendation has been made not to reemploy the administrator for the ensuing fiscal year, and if, by April 25, the administrator has not notified the board of education in writing by registered or certified mail that the administrator does not desire to be reemployed in the school district for the ensuing year, the administrator shall be considered as employed on a continuing contract basis and on the same salary schedule used in the school district for the ensuing fiscal year, and such employment and continuing contract shall be binding on the administrator and on

the school district. The provisions of this section shall apply to administrators as defined in Section 6-101.3 of this title, but shall not apply to superintendents.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1998.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
