(Department of Public Safety - budget categories -

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998, the
Department of Public Safety shall budget all funds in the following
categories and amounts:

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not
otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed

upon the Department of Public Safety by law shall be set by the Director. The Department of Public Safety for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures, except the full-time-equivalent employee limit shall not include cadets while they are members of a patrol school or during their employment in probationary status nor shall it include temporary Lake Patrol Officers employed pursuant to Section 840.8 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1997.
