

ENGROSSED HOUSE

An Act relating to fictitious name filings;
authorizing sole proprietorships using fictitious
names to file certificate; prescribing information
required; providing for filing with Secretary of
State; imposing fee for filing; providing for
apportionment; providing for codification; and
providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 81.1 of Title 54, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Any sole proprietor transacting business in this state under
a fictitious name, or a designation not showing the name of the
person, may file for recording with the Secretary of State, a
certificate, showing the identity of the person, using the legal
name of the person, his or her place of residence and mailing
address, and the mailing address and physical office address of each
place at which the sole proprietor conducts business using the
fictitious name.

B. The Secretary of State shall prescribe a form for sole
proprietorship registrations as authorized by this section.

C. The Secretary of State shall charge a fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) for fictitious name sole proprietorship filings authorized by this section. The fee prescribed by this section shall be deposited to the credit of the General Revenue Fund.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 1998.
