Oklahoma, upon the occasion of its 100th anniversary; and  
directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the City of Holdenville, Creek County, Indian  
Territory, was incorporated on November 14, 1898, United States  
Court Indian Territory Northern District having been named in 1895  
after J.S. Holden, the traffic manager of the new railroad, the  
Choctaw Oklahoma and Gulf, later the Rock Island; and

WHEREAS, the history of the area is linked to people of historic  
note such as Fabry de la Bruyere, Zebulon Pike, James Edwards,  
Theophilus Holmes, Jesse Chisholm, Henry Dodge, Henry Leavenworth,  
Jefferson Davis, Nathan Boone, Stand Watie, John Bemo, Mr. and Mrs.  
John Lilley, Robert McFarlin, James Chapman, and C.R. Anthony; and

WHEREAS, among the first settlers in this community were the  
families of Jack Brittain, John Jacobs, G.B. Roderick, John Marks,  
Charles Allen, Dick Allen, M.P. Embach, A.W. Scott, George McShan,  
and Henry Rankin; and

WHEREAS, the future of this centennial community is brighter  
because of such companies as The Pork Group, the Corrections  
Corporation of America, Rainbows and Halos, TransOK, and Chaffin  
Enterprises; and

WHEREAS, Holdenville is a certified city with award-winning  
schools, friendly, active churches, and good neighbors; and

WHEREAS, Centennial Chairman Andrew Young declares 1998 as the  
Year of the Centennial Community; and
