RESOLUTION NO. 1063 By: Covey and Pettigrew

A Resolution honoring the City of Geary, Oklahoma, upon the occasion of its 100th anniversary; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Cheyenne and Arapaho territory in Western Oklahoma was opened to settlers in 1892; and

WHEREAS, S.E. Huff and his son, Will D. Huff, staked claim to the land that would eventually become the site of Geary, Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, in the spring of 1898, from a wheat field, Geary arose in the night to a lively little town; and

WHEREAS, in July of 1898, the first train arrived in Geary bringing in hundreds of people and two ball teams to play ball and entertain the crowd; and

WHEREAS, Geary flourished in its early days and was a bustling city with many businesses; and

WHEREAS, the City of Geary is a wonderful community with a rich past and a bright future; and

WHEREAS, the City of Geary celebrated its centennial earlier this year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 46TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives honors the City of Geary, Oklahoma, upon the occasion of its 100th anniversary.
