A Concurrent Resolution urging the Corporation Commission to conduct the appropriate studies necessary to implement expanded area service for telephone customers in Mayes County; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, in today's age of advancing telecommunications, an effective but inexpensive telephone service is an essential need of our citizenry; and

WHEREAS, citizens rely on telephone service providers to assist them in meeting a variety of needs, ranging from personal communications to emergency assistance; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to promote economic development and improve the quality of life, it is necessary to reduce the costs associated with telephone services, especially long distance costs; and

WHEREAS, a number of local area calling zones have been expanded in Oklahoma in recent years, cutting long distance costs for consumers and facilitating better communications; and

WHEREAS, the Corporation Commission is charged with regulating the telecommunications industry, ensuring that the state's consumers receive the best, most inexpensive service possible.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 46TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature hereby urges the Corporation Commission to conduct the studies necessary to implement expanded area service for telephone customers in Mayes County, Oklahoma.
