RESOLUTION NO. 51 By: Dunlap

A Resolution declaring February 8 through February 15, 1998, as Vo-Tech Week in the State of Oklahoma; saluting the Tri County Technology Center on its 30th Birthday; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, in 1968 the Tri County Technology Center located in Bartlesville, Oklahoma, was the first area Vocational Technical District established in the State of Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, through innovative partnerships with the business sector improved delivery of services is accomplished; and

WHEREAS, through their hard work and effort, graduates of the Tri County Technology Center contribute to the economic base of its district; and

WHEREAS, community involvement in vocational education continues to improve the quality of its programs; and

WHEREAS, all Oklahoma citizens should support Vo-Tech Week and salute the Tri County Technology Center as this outstanding school and staff celebrate 30 years of success.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 46TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT the Oklahoma State Senate declares February 8 through February 15, 1998, as Vo-Tech Week in the State of Oklahoma.
