A Resolution praising the City of Howe; congratulating the City of Howe upon the occasion of its Centennial; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the City of Howe, located in LeFlore County, Oklahoma, five (5) miles north of Heavener, has a population of approximately 500 people; and

WHEREAS, Howe, Oklahoma, was originally known as Klondike. Its post office was established May 5, 1898. Howe was named for Dr. Herbert M. Howe of Philadelphia, Director of the Kansas City, Pittsburg and Gulf Railway, which is now the Kansas City Southern Railroad.
