A Resolution recognizing the Jenks High School Trojans as the 1996 Class 6A State Football Champions; congratulating the coaching staff and team; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Jenks, Oklahoma, is known as the "Antique Capital of Oklahoma". With a population of 8,781, Jenks has one of the lowest crime rates in Oklahoma. Centrally located in the United States, Jenks enjoys ready access to air, water and land transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Jenks School District serves parts of south Tulsa as well as the city of Jenks. The District includes seven primary and secondary schools with approximately 8,494 students. Located at 205 East B Street, Jenks High School has 2,045 students and 115 teachers; and

WHEREAS, the Jenks High School Trojans Class 6A football team continued their winning record during the 1996 high school football season with many team players distinguishing themselves; and

WHEREAS, Cory Callens was honored as the State of Oklahoma's Defensive Player of the Year, the Daily Oklahoman Prep Top 22 All State Defensive End, the Tulsa World All State Defensive End, and will play for Oklahoma in the Oil Bowl; and

WHEREAS, Andy Wisne was chosen by the Tulsa World as All State Defensive Tackle. During this season Andy Wisne had 32 unassisted tackles, 65 assisted tackles and six quarterback sacks; and

WHEREAS, junior Jason Lohr was selected as the Daily Oklahoman Prep Top 22 All State Defensive Tackle; and

WHEREAS, Josh Fidler was picked as the Daily Oklahoman Prep Top 22 All State Kicker, Tulsa World All State Running Back, Class 6A State Leading Scorer with 21 touchdowns, and the Gatorade Circle of Champions Oklahoma Player of the Year; and

WHEREAS, Tyler Bogan was the Tulsa World's choice for All State Defensive Back. Tyler had nine interceptions last season; and

WHEREAS, the 1996 Jenks Trojans had a team record of 13 wins and only one loss. They were district, regional and area champions as well as Class 6A State Football Champions. The Trojans led the state in defense allowing only 433 yards rushing, 1,350 yards passing, 9.2 points per game and 2.7 yards per play. Their offense averaged 6.8 yards per rush and 34 points per game. The 1996 Senior team members had a three-year combined record of 35 wins against only three losses. The entire team grade point average for 1996 was 3.08 out of a possible 4.0 grade point average.
