AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to schools; providing certain due process relating to teacher certification; specifying such due process; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-203 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any person after completion of two (2) years in the residency program who is not recommended for certification, or any other person who is denied certification or who is subject to having such certification revoked, for any reason other than a criminal conviction for a violent crime, shall have the right to a hearing before the State Board of Education. Unless otherwise required by law, the hearing shall be conducted as an individual proceeding pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1997.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby

declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
