HOUSE BILL NO. 1789

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to crimes and punishments;

prohibiting certain acts relating to certain sexual  
conduct by persons less than twenty-one years of  
age; providing penalties; providing for  
codification; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1021.1a of Title 21, unless  
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. It is unlawful for any person less than twenty-one (21)  
years of age to perform acts in public, in establishments, or for-  
hire depicting, describing or relating to sexual conduct including,  
but not limited to topless or bottomless dancing, exotic dancing,  
stripping, or similar entertainment.

B. It is unlawful for any person or establishment to employ a  
person less than twenty-one (21) years of age to perform the acts  
specified in subsection A of this section.

C. Any person convicted of violating subsection A or B of this  
section shall be guilty of a felony.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
