AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to elections; providing for factors for determination of residency; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4-101.1 of Title 26, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. In determining residency for purposes of voter registration pursuant to Article IV of the Oklahoma Election Code, the following information may be taken into account:

1. Possession of a valid Oklahoma driver license or identification card issued by the Department of Public Safety;
2. Oklahoma vehicle registration;
3. Proof of payment of in-state resident tuition fees for an institution of higher learning in this state; or
4. An affidavit that the person is a resident of the precinct, is not in the precinct for temporary purposes only, and does not intend to leave the precinct when the purpose that brought the person into the precinct is accomplished.

B. A person shall not be considered to be a resident of any precinct of this state into which the person has come for temporary

purposes only, without the intention of making it the person's residence, but with the intention of leaving the precinct when the person has accomplished the purpose that brought the person into the precinct.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 1997.
