AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to education; providing a definition of educational technology; listing examples of information technology and telecommunications technology; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-107.1 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Unless otherwise specifically defined, educational technology shall include both information technology and telecommunications technology. Information technology shall include but not be limited to computers, multimedia material, facsimile, e-mail, computer software, CD ROM material, computer simulations, the World Wide Web (WWW) or Internet, Listservs, multiuser domains and distance learning or education. Telecommunications technology shall include but not be limited to local area networks and wide area networks.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
