HOUSE BILL NO. 3223

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to counties and county officers;
amending 19 O.S. 1991, Section 421.2, as amended by
Section 1, Chapter 227, O.S.L. 1992 (19 O.S. Supp.
1997, Section 421.2), which relates to surplus
machinery, equipment or vehicles; clarifying
language; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 1991, Section 421.2, as
amended by Section 1, Chapter 227, O.S.L. 1992 (19 O.S. Supp. 1997,
Section 421.2), is amended to read as follows:

Section 421.2 A unanimous vote of the board of county
commissioners may transfer any machinery, equipment or vehicle
belonging to the county, which is deemed by the board to be surplus,
to a political subdivision of the state within that county which is
in need of such machinery, equipment or vehicle to benefit a
significant part of the public served by the county; provided,
however, one of the county commissioners voting in the majority is
the county commissioner from whose district the subject property is
to be transferred. Upon such transfer, the subject property shall
be removed from the inventory of the county. The board of county
commissioners may not deem any property to be surplus during the

period of time beginning thirty (30) days before the filing period for any election of a county commissioner and ending the day after a county commissioner is sworn in as such. When the political subdivision receiving such property declares same to be surplus, the governing body shall give written notice to the county of its intent to transfer such property back to the county. The board of county commissioners shall have up to fifteen (15) days from the date of receipt of ~~such~~ the notice to either accept or reject the property. The political subdivision shall transfer such property back to the county only if the board of county commissioners agrees to accept the property or the board fails to respond within the fifteen-day time period.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 1998.
